REPORT OF THE LEISURE SERVICES MANAGER

Purpose of Report

To inform and update Members on developments at Woodford Park Leisure Centre

General Matters

Meetings with Wokingham Borough Sport Development Team and 1Life

Since the last meeting I have met with the Sport and Leisure Manager for Wokingham Borough Council on two occasions to share ideas and discuss possible projects that we might be able to work on in partnership going forwards. These meetings will now take place once a month and will include 1Life, as agreed between the three organisations.

Easter Opening hours

As in previous years members are asked to approve the proposed Easter opening hours for Woodford Park Leisure Centre below: -

Friday 3 April 9am – 5pm Saturday 4 April 9am – 5pm Sunday 5 April 9am – 5pm Monday 6 April 9am – 5pm

UK Active

A meeting was recently held with representatives from UK Active who are keen for Woodley Town Council to become members. UK Active is a not-for-profit body comprised of members and partners from across the UK active lifestyle sector. It provides services and facilitates partnerships for a broad range of organisations including operators of fitness facilities, local authority leisure centres, leisure trusts, outdoor fitness providers, Public Health, education and training providers. Wokingham Borough Council's Sport Development team are already a member.

The cost to become a member is £455 per year for which the following benefits are available:

- A potential discount on our PPL 'exercise to music ' licence. UK active dedicated licencing team are on hand to help WTC make savings
- Advice and guidance on application funding.
- UK Active benchmarking looking at how the performance of a facility compares to the industry average and other major operators
- Keep up to date with the sector by receiving UK active daily media review and all associated media
- Discounts on places at UK active events
- UK Active handbook with programmes and initiatives to drive performance
- UK Active webinars
- UK Active seminars discussing key sector topics or issues with industry leaders and decision makers

I believe there will be a benefit to becoming a member of UK Active. Members are asked to consider the purchase of an annual membership of £455, which can be met within Woodford Park Leisure Centre's budget estimates for 2015/16.

Sports Development

Woodley Sports Week

Plans are progressing well for our annual Woodley Sports Week between 18 and 23 May. Regular meetings are taking place with the School Games Organiser for Wokingham Borough and the Head of PE at Bulmershe School in the build up to the week. Any Members wishing to attend any of the events (see attached programme of events) should contact the Leisure Services Manager.

Orienteering

As part of our continued work with the Wokingham School Games Organiser, we have been working in partnership to use Woodford Park as the orienteering site for the Wokingham schools level 2 competitions. The Regional Officer for Orienteering is currently mapping out the course. This is being paid for by funding from the School Games Organiser. Training will then be given to officers at WPLC and selected teachers from Wokingham schools to run the level 2 event. Following the event, orienteering will open up the opportunity to work with local schools to offer school days out within Woodford Park in the summer.

Woodford Park Leisure Centre

Easter Holiday activities

Woodford Park Leisure Centre is looking to run 10 activity sports camps during the Easter holidays. Activities include Trampolining, Toddler Trampolining, Badminton, Karate, Multi-Skills and Cheer Leading. Marketing for all of the above can be found on the Town Council website.

3G artificial football pitch project - update

Since the last meeting the Council been granted planning permission for the 3G pitch project. Approval to borrow funds of £255,000, to fund the anticipated 50% of the project costs, has also been given by the Department of Communities and Local Government. The Town Council's consultant submitted an Expression of interest application to the Football Foundation for the remaining 50% of the costs, before the deadline of 20 February 2015. We have received confirmation from the Football Foundation that they have received our application for funding and expect a decision in early April.

In the meantime, the Council has been allocated a Technical Project Officer from the Football Foundation to start to move the project forward. This officer has already been in touch regarding the need to carry out the Foundation's framework agreement works as soon as possible. These works will provide us with a technical overview of the project in readiness for the detailed development of the specification and appointment of a contractor to do the works. It will also provide a mini tender estimate that will give us a better grasp of cost certainty before any grant award is made. It is important that we do this so that we get the grant request right.

The cost to carry out this piece of work is £4029.38 + VAT. These costs would be incurred anyway and are all included as project costs, i.e. eligible for funding. The purchase order for this work was approved by the Town Clerk and e-mailed to the Football Foundation on 11 March to enable this first phase of the framework agreement to be implemented. Funds for this will be allocated from the earmarked 3G pitch project reserve and will form part of the costs that can be covered by the grant funding, should the Council's application be successful.

New artificial cricket wicket – Woodford Park

Funding is currently being sourced for the new artificial wicket through the ECB (English Cricket Board) in partnership with Last Man Stands, the grass roots version of 2020 Cricket. The Council has obtained 3 quotes for the replacement wicket, which have been passed on to Last Man Stands, who will be applying for the funding through the ECB, and who have a better chance of receiving funding given their participation in grass roots cricket initiatives. The next round of this funding is open from 1 April.

If successful, Last Man Stands wish to hire the artificial wicket on Monday, Thursday and Friday evenings and on Sundays when Woodley Cricket Club are not using the wicket.

In recognition of the support from Last Man Stands in achieving the funding for the new wicket, which costs in the region of between £8,000 - £10,000, normal practice is for them to have use of the wicket for £25 per game. It is proposed that in the first season following the installation of the new wicket that Last Man Stands be charged £25 per game, rising to £30 a game in the second year, and as a local league gets established. From thereon the Council would look to increase the charge year on year to bring it into line with the ordinary rate charged for the artificial wicket (£72 for adults, £30 for under 18s).

As this special arrangement would be outside the Council's current pricing structure, Members are asked to consider the above proposal for the charges to Last Man Stands for the use of the artificial wicket.

REPORT OF THE SERVICE SUPPORT MANAGER

Purpose of Report

To inform Members of matters concerning the Town Council's buildings and maintenance of the facilities.

Vandalism

- Minor damage to allotment fencing.
- Minor offensive graffiti on graffiti wall in Woodford Park.

Woodford Park Leisure Centre

Refurbishment

The Ladies changing rooms have been completely refurbished. The work included replacement flooring, bench seating, tiling, showers, lights, ventilation and plastering of walls. Similar work to the Gents changing rooms is scheduled for the next few weeks.

Windows

The windows have been replaced in the function room and tea room including the fire exit door from the kitchen. Works were carried out by a local contractor at a cost of £5,850, funded from the 2014/15 Capital Programme.

Woodford Park

Bowling Club

The fir trees along the boundary of the bowling green and the main car park have been removed. The root system of these trees has been causing damage to the path around the green, the green surface and the irrigation system. The old damaged railings will be removed and replaced with a 1.8m high, black powder coated steel weldmesh fence, similar to that often used around schools and sports grounds. This work is scheduled for week commencing 13 April. Hedging will be planted in front of the fencing which once established will be attractive, while acting as a wind break and a deterrent for unauthorised access. Woodley Bowling Club have showed support for the project and will continue to be consulted and informed as the project progresses.

Western Avenue Entrance

Officers arranged with Wokingham Borough Council for a quantity of road planings from resurfacing work in Oak Drive to be deposited at the site. The Town Council's Grounds Team spread and compacted this loose material as much as possible to provide a temporary repair to the surface along most of the length of the track. The Town Council is now licenced as a waste carrier in order to receive such materials and may be able to obtain more in future.

Seating

Two residents have made donations to sponsor memorial seats in the Park. These additional seats will be installed in the two next weeks overlooking the playing fields. Sponsored seats remain the property of the Town Council and are added to the Council's maintenance programme. The Town Council sources and installs the seats and the sponsor is able to have a plaque installed on the seat.

Flagpole

The following costings have been obtained for the provision of a single flagpole and flag;

10m Fibreglass flag pole – internal halyard	£634.00
Delivery of pole	£150
3 yard sewn woven Union Flag	£98.50
Installation of concrete foundation	£1,000
Total	£1,882.50

There is guidance available from the Department for Communities and Local Government and the Flag institute regarding the flying of flags and the Council would need to agree a protocol regarding which flags are to be flown and when.

Tree Works

Tree Works have been carried out in Woodford Park and Malone Park including the removal of a some dead/diseased trees and maintenance work to some substantial healthy trees. This work is funded from the tree works budget along with the Bowling Club tree work detailed in the report.

Community Halls

The new flooring at Chapel Hall has been well received by hirers and has made a significant improvement. The Caretakers at Chapel and Coronation Halls will be carrying out a spring clean over the Easter period where bookings are fewer.
