9. **ALLOTMENTS UPDATE**

There are currently 21 people on the waiting list for a plot. There are 6 untenanted plots and these are in very poor condition. These plots will be offered to those on the waiting list although they will not lose their place on the waiting list if they wish to wait for a plot in better condition. This is in recognition of the amount of work that would be required to return these plots to use. The Council's Maintenance Team cleared several plots in August that were in a similar condition, using a hired digger which was on site for other works. These plots have been allocated to new tenants.

As in previous years the water supplies will be isolated once the ground frosts start in order to preserve the pipework.

The Chairman of the Allotment Tenants Association has been in contact with the Chairman of the Community Services Committee and the Deputy Town Clerk regarding preventative works to reinforce an area of fencing along the boundary with Pitts Lane footpath. This work will be scheduled into the Maintenance Team's work programme.

Chris Lynham, a long time allotment tenant and previous Chairman of the Allotment Tenants Association, passed away in October following a period of ill health. Chris spent many years working with the Council on allotment matters and was a familiar face at the allotment site, in the Town Council offices and at the leisure centre.

Woodley Detached report November 2015

Young people are spending time in Woodford Park in the early evening and there are also some small groups in Vauxhall Car Park and around TESCO Express and in the precinct. Since September there have been more young people in Sandford Park from 9:00 pm onwards. The atmosphere has been good and the young people have been engaging really well.

Our new Woodley Team Leader Fiona is recruiting and strengthening and developing new and existing volunteers on the team. She is very keen to introduce more sports based activities.

We have made it clear that there are no funds but we have asked young people for their suggestions regarding the ground underneath the A329M bridges. Suggestions so far: BMX, free running area (put up obstacles and people run through them). Different people on various boards are involved and are looking at how to include the less able in these plans.

Training & Staff

Our new staff: Fiona and Michaela, working with Woodley young people, are integrating into the team really well and are full of fresh ideas and enthusiasm – they have hit the ground running and have been very, very busy.

Mentoring sessions continue to take place weekly, in the community, and at Rehoboth. We are still working with other key agencies on complex cases and family issues.

Equine sessions: Young people from Woodley continue to come to the stables on Saturday all day, Thursday all day and Wednesday PM. Some of these are for sessions or supported volunteer sessions / development. The young people continue to enjoy the horses and sharing their life challenges with each other and with our staff.

Shelter: We haven't yet had time to gather the material to fix up the shelter in Woodford Park, but the young people are keen to do this.

Young mums sewing group stopped for the summer break and there will be discussions as to how that goes forward in the autumn.

Inside Out stopped for 3 weeks over September but is starting again now.

Councillors' visit to Rehoboth: Suggested dates for the visit are Saturday 21 or Saturday 28 November, from 10:30am.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations of interest were made.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the meeting held on 2 September 2015 were agreed as a correct record.

LODDON MEAD AREA – POTENTIAL PROJECT

Deborah Brown reported on the information she had received regarding flooding levels. The area was in a Level 2 flooding area and a project may not need permission from the Environment Agency. However, if a planning application were submitted for a project a flood risk assessment would be required. A plan showing the flood area was tabled at the meeting. The Environment Agency (EA) also advised that there would be restrictions on structures that reduced the flow of water in a potential flood area and that any structures within 8m of the river would require flood defence consent. Deborah Brown was seeking preliminary advice from the EA which she would forward to the partnership and she would also raise the matter of fallen trees in the river around that area which it was thought could also increase the flooding risk.

Deborah Mander reported that she had received three emails from nearby residents expressing concern about the plans to use the area under the A3290 and their experience of noise and disturbance in the past. One letter had also raised the matter of debris falling from the road onto the area under the roadway and Deborah Brown also agreed to investigate this and any associated safety concerns.

Jackie Andrews reported that the Me2 Club would like to involved in ideas for the area and discussions on how to make any plans successful.

Trina Farrance reported that she had visited the site with a Parkour designer who had been enthusiastic and believed it had great potential and that it would be easy to design something for young people that would be inclusive.

Mary Walker reported that she, Deborah Mander and Sam Milligan had visited Bulmershe Gym to see a Parkour indoor session and to speak with the coach who had indicated he would be keen to be involved with the project.

The tabled information from Richard Dolinski reporting on his approach to Addington School was noted and all agreed that the plan for accreditation for the students was a bonus to the school's involvement in the potential project.

Sam Milligan reported that he had approached Thames Water about using volunteers to help with any project.

It was agreed that before making any decisions on the potential project the safety issue raised by a local resident be investigated. During the discussion it was noted that part of the Park and Ride was also under the roadway.

Deborah Brown agreed to follow the safety matter up with Highways and Customer Services at WBC.

Deborah Mander agreed to seek any information the Neighbourhood Police Team had about incidents in that area.

The next step, if the area is viable for the project would be to establish what the project should be and the potential costs. An extra meeting would be called, if appropriate.

FUNDING REQUEST

It was agreed that this item would go forward to the agenda for the meeting in January when it was hoped that more information about the funding request would be provided.

REPORTS

Written reports from JAC and the Town Council, circulated with the agenda, were noted.

Graham Sumbler reported that the Friday Group at the Venue was proving popular with Year 7s at Waingels College.

Paul Brown reported that there hadn't been an increase yet in numbers at the sessions they were running at Goals.

Kay Gilder's Octopush Club on Sundays (7 - 8.30pm) had spaces for swimmers aged 12 upwards. Several members of the club had now left to go to university.

OPEN FORUM

The Chairman asked for ideas that the Partnership could pursue to help and support young people in our town.

Three suggestions were made:

- 1. A café for young people were they could meet up under cover, get soft/hot drinks and some food. There was some discussion about the use of the Inn on the Park once it closed, although it was reported that options for this area were already being investigated.
- 2. Making good and fruitful contact and engagement with young people through the schools, particularly at assemblies. This would enable two-way conversations and help the partnership in its direction. The matter of social media and how to engage was discussed and it was suggested that the partnership could approach the secondary schools to discuss a student project to provide a 'what's on' for young people in Woodley. Jackie Andrews would be able to contact secondary schools on this.
- Reading Community Football was seeking funding for work in engaging families in areas of deprivation and one of these could be in Woodley, after the pilot in Finchampstead is complete.

CONSULTATION FOR TVP PARK & RIDE PLANS

Two public consultation events are being held in November looking at Wokingham Borough Council's

£3.6million proposals to build a new park and ride (P&R) at Thames Valley Park (TVP) east of Reading.

The scheme would complement the new P&Rs at Winnersh Triangle and Mereoak, and slightly older one

at Madejski Stadium.

The exhibition exploring the plans is being held at the Wokingham Waterside Centre, Thames Valley

Park Drive, Berkshire, RG6 1PQ on Wednesday November 4, from 3 to 6pm and Thursday November 12,

noon to 3pm. General public are welcome alongside business park workers.

The events are part of a month-long consultation, from November 4 to December 4. If people cannot

attend the exhibition they can visit www.myjourneywokingham.com/park-and-ride to find out more,

and if they wish complete an online form.

The scheme is looking at a site west of the roundabout between the A3290 and Thames Valley Park

Drive. It is currently undeveloped and bordered by a railway line (south) and the River Thames (north).

A P&R in this location could help reduce traffic heading east into Reading and ease congestion on

London Road at Cemetery Junction (with the A329); making local journeys more reliable.

It would better use existing public transport routes between TVP and Reading, cut car emissions from

fewer vehicles driving into Reading and give motorists an alternative when travelling into Reading on the

A4, or A3290.

"We're right at the start of the process here, looking into the proposals in more detail, so we hope to

and encourage people take part," said Cllr John Kaiser, executive member for planning and highways.

"People's input will be analysed and a then report outlining the main findings published. This will help

shape the final decision, so you're input is very important.

"If plans get the green light the site could be ready 2017 making this our third in the borough recently;

Winnersh Triangle several weeks ago and Mereoak a few months before. Both are doing well.

"They underline how seriously we're taking the problem of managing traffic issues on the borough's

roads while also giving people better travel options."

The scheme would be funded by a The Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) grant and contributions from

the private sector. LEP funding would come from central government, rather than local taxation.

These proposals are not part of the East Reading Mass Rapid Transit Route. That is a different project

which will go out public consultation if given the go-ahead.

COUNCIL LOOKING AHEAD TO SECURE BOROUGH'S LONG-TERM PROSPERITY AND POPULARITY

The first step in the process to protect the long-term prosperity and popularity of Wokingham Borough for residents and businesses will be taken this week with the publication of a Strategic Housing Market Assessment (SHMA), which has been produced in partnership with the five other Berkshire authorities and the Thames Valley Berkshire Local Enterprise Partnership.

The SHMA is a technical assessment of the number of homes the area will need to ensure it continues to be the UK's economic engine room as well as a great place to live. All Local Authorities are required to produce a SHMA in order to assess the future need for housing in the local area and then to set their housing target through their Local Plan (produced through engagement with residents and co-operation with other local authorities).

Executive member for planning and highways ClIr John Kaiser said: "Wokingham Borough is a great success story — we have wonderful schools, more and more parks, play areas and nature reserves, a thriving economy and extremely low-crime rates. Businesses want to do business here and people want to live here - and those are the winning ingredients we need to maintain. The council in 2010 allocated four large Strategic Development Locations, which 'consume their own smoke' in terms of providing the infrastructure needed, including a substantial road programme, to ensure new housing is in sustainable locations.

"The SHMA is a dry, technical document but it is directly linked to those winning ingredients because it gives us the foundation stone on which to build our long-term plans. From the SHMA, we will be able to agree housing numbers for each authority and, from that figure, we'll be able to plan where the homes go and what schools, roads, health facilities, parks, play areas, sports and community facilities and nature reserves are needed to maintain our high quality of life. This will be set out in the new Local Plan."

- MORE -

The way Wokingham Borough will accommodate its homes will be set out in a new Local Plan and there

will be significant consultation and engagement with residents when this is produced.

Cllr Kaiser added: "It is vital that people realise that more homes are coming to the borough - and that

they will come regardless of whether we carry out a SHMA, Local Plan or anything else. But, by

producing a SHMA and then a robust Local Plan we can retain greater control over where homes go and

how they are planned and to make sure we maximise benefits for existing residents - the alternative is a

developers' free-for-all where we get housing everywhere and anywhere but not the infrastructure

needed.

"The SHMA is a highly technical document that objectively produces a figure for housing need, which is

broadly indicative of potential housing numbers we may need to provide for. But we will want to consult

and engage as widely as possible when it comes to the Local Plan."

CHANGES HAVE BROUGHT COLOUR AND COMPLIMENTS TO GRASS CUTTING SERVICE

The trial changes to Wokingham Borough Council's grass cutting service introduced this year have proved a success and will be built on in years to come.

After a difficult summer in 2014, the borough council listened to residents' views and worked with its contractor to improve the service this summer.

The changes tried this summer have been:

- Targeting areas that need a higher level of maintenance such as play areas and sports pitches
- Introducing long grass areas which provide more diverse natural habitats for wildlife
- Wildflower borders in highly visible areas in order to enhance biodiversity and provide attractive landscapes.

These changes have helped the council keep on top of grass cutting, support biodiversity and enhance the appearance of some parts of the Wokingham Borough without additional cost. The council has also invited comments on the changes and these have been generally supportive.

Executive member for environment Cllr Angus Ross said: "The difference between this summer and last summer is incredible and credit must go to the residents who took part in our consultation and helped us plan improvements.

"We understood the frustration last year; we listened to what people told us and used that information to plan a better service. The benefits to biodiversity may take a longer time to quantify, but it is clear already that we've been on top of grass cutting in the important areas and have improved the look of a few of our parks. The next challenge is to build on this year's success in the long-term."

MORE-

The borough council has used this year's changes to draw-up a new grounds maintenance contract which has been now been put out to tender. This new contract offers greater flexibility and has been informed by the successes of this year. The council will require whoever is awarded the contract to build on this year's success.

The wildflower trials introduced this year were in Cantley Park (Wokingham), Ashenbury Park (Woodley) and on the Woosehill Spine Road. Residents are encouraged to suggest other wildflower sites for the future.
