# Central & Eastern Berkshire Authorities - Joint Minerals and Waste Plan: Regulation 18 Issues and Options Consultation

Bracknell Forest Council, Reading Borough Council, the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead, and Wokingham Borough Council (collectively referred to as the 'Central & Eastern Berkshire Authorities') are working in partnership to produce a Joint Minerals & Waste Plan which will guide minerals and waste decision-making in the Plan area.

The Joint Minerals & Waste Plan will build upon the formerly adopted minerals and waste plans for the Berkshire area, eventually providing replacement policies based on up to date evidence of the current levels of provision for minerals and waste facilities in the Plan area. Importantly, the Plan aims to establish the future levels of provision required to meet national and regional policy targets and objectives. It will set out a new Vision of how this will be achieved and provide details of strategic sites that we propose will deliver that Vision.

In accordance with the Town and Country Planning (Local Plans) Regulations 2012, an Issues and Options Consultation paper has been produced and this forms the first stage of the plan preparation. The Paper sets out the Vision and Objectives of the Plan, as well as the initial issues and options regarding minerals and waste data which will inform the Plan. The purpose of this consultation is to provide an opportunity for stakeholders and the community to consider the important issues around the extraction of minerals and management of waste before any decisions are taken on Preferred Options.

The Issues and Options consultation paper poses a series of questions to prompt discussion and elicit further evidence. You can respond to as many of the questions as you feel are appropriate to you or the organisation which you represent. There is also capacity to make free text comments on any matter that you feel would help consideration of these issues.

The Consultation Paper is supported by a number of evidence base documents including:

- Minerals: Background Study
- Waste: Background Study
- Methodology Reports (including for assessment of Sites, Transport & Landscape)
- Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report (incorporating Strategic Environmental Assessment)
- Habitats Regulations Assessment: Methodology and Baseline
- Consultation Strategy
- Equalities Impact Assessment.



#### WOODLEY SHOPS PARKING PETITION

Thank you for your petition received by Wokingham Borough Council which included 13 signatures between the period of 11 January 2017 to 11 April 2017.

Motorists may choose to park in the car parks provided in the knowledge that they will need to pay for the service being provided by the Council. Parking charges are needed for the upkeep and management of car parks. Allowing free parking for all, or only those that work or live at the shopping centre would not comply with the Council's parking policy, nor be considered fair to the other users of the car park that pay for the same service.

Regarding parking elsewhere on the adjacent road network. This is controlled by traffic regulation orders (TRO's), road marking and signs across the Borough to allow some on street car parking in a controlled manner designed to best meet multiple road user parking needs including residents, visitors, business and deliveries. Providing enough parking, along with increasing car ownership, is challenging for the Council, particularly in historic areas with narrow streets as vehicle access including emergency vehicles, reducing congestion and ensuring road safety are all prioritised when deciding who can park where via the restrictions imposed.

I am sorry I cannot be more helpful in this instance, however I hope you can understand why the Council has taken this approach.
