186. ROYAL BERKSHIRE FIRE AUTHORITY BUDGET AND COUNCIL TAX CONSULTATION 2019/20

Correspondence had been received from the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority regarding proposed increases to the council tax in 2019/20 and subsequent years. Members had been notified of the proposals ahead of the meeting, and comments requested, as a response was required by 20 February 2019.

Members noted that a response had been sent to the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority Budget and Council Tax consultation 2019/20 stating that the Town Council had no objection to the proposed increase of £1.92 in the council tax for 2019/20, but felt that the proposed increase of up to £5 per year in subsequent years should be resisted, and suggested that the increase be raised by £1 each year until the cap of £5 increase per year was reached.

1. Minutes of the previous meeting (05.12.18) / matters arising

• Funding for public safety information leaflets - £240 now received from Woodley Town Council. The forum has been awarded £40 by Earley Town Council. This money will be paid into the account until the spring. However, the forum already has £40 in other donations so this can be used to fund the printing of the leaflets for N Earley if needed before the ETC grant arrives. Leaflet now in draft form. Chair is waiting for one piece of information and will then contact printers for a quote. It is hoped that Waingels students will provide a logo as part of their graphics projects.

ACTION: Chair to:

- o Complete leaflet
- Obtain quotes for printing
- o Go ahead with printing once all information in leaflet has been verified.
- TVP events Julie Susel (TVP) plans to work with PC Mills to organise 2 information cafes, probably focussing on fraud / rogue traders. There will be an evening one in Woodley (Oakwood Centre) and an afternoon in Earley (Crescent Centre). Dates have not yet been agreed.

ACTION: Chair to circulate dates once the are agreed.

• Neighbourhood Watch – chair contacted Insp Al Lloyd asking how NW co-ordinators could contact each other. Karen Collins (TVP) replied on 011.02.19: Due to GDPR regulations, I suggest we (TVP) contact the local NW Co-ordinators and advise them that your community forum would be interested in providing them with information regarding meetings etc. If you have no objection, I can give them the forum chair's email address and ask them to contact you if they are interested. I have spoken to a NW Co-ordinator who is also one of our TVP volunteers, and she believes there is a mechanism through the National NW system where co-ordinators can request to contact each other, but she has never used it.

Chair has agreed to Karen passing on the forum email address to local co-ordinators and hopefully they will receive information about the April meeting. Discussion on the effectiveness of the NW scheme ensured. It was agreed that it was difficult to ascertain whether or not the scheme was still active (with a current co-ordinator) in a specific street. Signs from 20 years ago remain on the lamp posts so residents may well assume that there is still a co-ordinator when in practice it is likely that many have moved away. There was also discussion as to whether or not the scheme was still needed now that Thames Valley Alert was up and running. It was agreed, however, that many residents in the area still did not have easy access to the internet and would benefit from regular information (and possibly visits) from a representative in their street. It was also agreed that the scheme could do with a 'revamp' to generate the interest of potential co-ordinators.

ACTIONS:

- i. Sgt Smith for find out more information about the scheme for the next meeting;
- ii. Chair to investigate leaflets which advertise the scheme, the possibility of a NW 'leaflet drop' in specific areas and eventually include some information on the forum website.
- Remit of the forum one resident questioned the remit of the forum was it to discuss any issues of concern to Woodley or N Earley residents or was it to only concern itself with police matters. It was agreed that the forum, while no longer organised by the police, was mainly concerned with

2. Update from Neighbourhood Policing Team

The local Neighbourhood PT now have 1.6 police officers and have 2 new PCSOs starting in March. One PCSO vacancy remains. There have been several arrests locally, including for shoplifting and breaking a conditional order regarding begging.

3. Local policing priorities – Review of progress / agree actions with respect to:

- **Burglary** Following a number of local burglaries at the end of last year a police operation was launched and several arrests made. Instances of burglary now low and it was agreed that burglary should be removed from the priority list.
- Antisocial behaviour (ASB) Little to report at present. One or two individuals are still being monitored and any issues (few at present) are dealt with as they happen.
- Speeding Sgt Smith reported that both the Woodley Independent Speedwatch and the TVP Speedwatch were up and running with warning letters going out. The Speedwatch team already had a number of streets due for monitoring on their list but residents should report other streets of concern to the forum or Woodley Town Council or to PC Radu at Bracknell&Wokingham-Speedwatch@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk If the initial monitoring shows that there is a speeding problem the forum will be informed and decisions as to the next steps (involving the police) will then be taken
- Communication 101 / 999 Nationally misuse of 999 (by users requiring a service other than the police) has led to an unprecedented number of calls to the police. A new system has been installed which should filter out these calls (really for other agencies) and so the response to both 999 and 101 should improve. It was reported that responses to 101 were still slow last month.
- Fly-tipping not a major problem though sometimes in Shepherds House Lane (Earley).
- Travellers Sgt Smith explained that using Sec 61 to evict travellers was not as easy as people thought. There was much that landowners (often the local council) could do to deter travellers, including making sites secure. Car parks in Woodley now much better. Residents encouraged to check any open council spaces secure and contact council if they are not.

Priorities remain speeding and anti-social behaviour

4. Communications

- **Website** still a work in progress. The chair is still looking for someone willing to keep the website up-to-date, run the blog and manage a Facebook page.
- Reaching a wider audience chair is in touch with Waingels College and keeping them informed of
 forum activities and meetings. It is hoped that they may send representatives to one of the
 meetings. It would be useful to have some input from Bulmershe and Beechwood schools.
 ACTION: Shirley Boyt to get in touch with a contact she has at Bulmershe.
- AGM 10th April, 7.30pm Oakwood Centre. The AGM will be an open meeting with the usual report
 from the local police and review of the local policing priorities. However, there will be a short report
 of the years activities and a financial report, followed by election of chair and vice-chair, at the
 beginning of the meeting. PLEASE NOTE: The current chair is not standing for re-election so
 nominations for chair are needed.

ACTION: Chair to:

- Circulate AGM agenda at least 2 weeks before the meeting.
- o Ensure details of AGM are printed in the Woodley Herald and ACER newsletter.

5. AOB

- **Consultation on WBC Local Plan** Meeting were reminded of the information evening for Woodley residents at the Oakwood Centre on Tuesday, 12th February, 7-9pm
- Wokingham Borough News delivery Many residents in Woodley and N Earley did not receive the winter copy of the Wokingham Borough News or 'Homes for the Future' the latter containing details of the consultation on the local plan. Cllr Matthews and the chair had contacted WBC regarding this delivery failure and they had acknowledged that there had been a problem. Cllr Matthews was continuing to monitor the situation.

- **Coppice Road Parking** Coppice Road residents wished to thank WBC for sending out traffic Wardens to deal with parking on the double yellow lines and the verges.
- **Dinton Pastures –** some reports that dogs had been poisoned by bait.
